**ORDER GRANTING COMPLEX
CHAPTER 11 BANKRUPTCY CASE TREATMENT**

This case was filed on March 23, 2026. On March 23, 2026, the Debtors filed a *Notice of Designation as Complex Chapter 11 Case*. [ECF Doc. 3]. Based on its review of the initial pleadings, the Court concludes that the complex Chapter 11 designation is appropriate.

Accordingly,

IT IS ORDERED that the Procedures for Complex Chapter 11 Cases Filed in the United States Bankruptcy Court for the Eastern District of Louisiana (the “Complex Case Procedures”) established by General Order 2019-4, amended as of January 10, 2025, shall apply to this case. The Complex Case Procedures are posted on the Court’s website, <https://www.laeb.uscourts.gov/>. Compliance with the Complex Case Procedures is required.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the Debtors must give notice of this Order to all parties in interest within seven (7) days. If a party-in-interest objects to the provisions of this Order, that party may file an appropriate motion within fourteen (14) days after service of this Order.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the Local Rules for the United States Bankruptcy Court for the Eastern District of Louisiana apply to this case, unless otherwise ordered by the

Court. If a conflict exists between the Local Rules and the Complex Case Procedures, the Complex Case Procedures shall govern.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the Debtor shall within seven (7) days serve this Order via first-class U.S. Mail on the required parties who will not receive a copy through the Court's CM/ECF system pursuant to the Federal Rules of Bankruptcy Procedure and this Court's Local Rules and file a certificate of service to that effect within three (3) days.
