STANDING ORDER NO. 2007-1

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the following applies to related cases:

- (a) **Defined.** Related cases are cases where assignment to a single judge would promote efficient administration of the estates or avoid conflicting or inconsistent rulings. Related cases include:
 - (1) Identical individuals or entities, e.g., DBA's;
 - (2) A corporation and any major shareholder thereof;
 - (3) Affiliates;
 - (4) A partnership and any of its general partners;
 - (5) Two or more general partners;
 - (6) Husband and wife;
 - (7) Entities having substantial identity of financial interests or assets.
- (b) **Notice of Related Cases.** In the event there are related bankruptcy cases, the debtor must file a Notice of Related Case(s) at the time of filing of a petition for relief, and must serve a copy of the notice upon the United States

Trustee. The notice must list the name, filing date, and case number of any related cases.

- (c) **Transfer.** The Court may, on its own motion or upon the motion of a party in interest, order a case transferred to another bankruptcy judge based on the Court's determination as to whether a case is related and whether the transfer will promote the efficient administration of the estates or avoid inconsistent or conflicting rulings.
- (d) **Procedure.** A motion by a party in interest to transfer a case or cases must be addressed to the judge presiding in the earliest filed case and served on the debtors and all trustees appointed in the cases.
